Last chance to take part in our GDNF trial! Recruitment closing in the next month.

This £2million trial is funded by Parkinson's UK, with support from the Cure Parkinson's Trust and in association with the North Bristol NHS Trust. Because GDNF is a large protein it's quite difficult to get it into the brain. In this trial participants will have surgery to implant a device that can deliver GDNF directly into the right area of the brain. The researchers are looking for participants between 35-75 who have had Parkinson's for at least 5 years and are willing to travel regularly to Bristol.
