As part of our degree course, we are undertaking a research project for our Honours dissertation. The title of our project is: *"A questionnaire to establish the barriers and the facilitators to physical activity in people with Parkinson's Disease in Lothian."*

As all data is anonymous, no identifiable information will be evident on the returned questionnaires. The results may be published in a journal or presented at a conference with the permission of QMU. The anonymous data collected through this study will be kept for a period of five years in a secure location in the University.
