

Individual Pineapple Treat

This can be made with any crunchy biscuit and the fruit / zest of your choice

Ingredients

- 3 ginger biscuits
- 1 tbsp butter
- 5 tbsp full-fat cream cheese (also known as soft cheese)
- 2 tbsp double cream or coconut cream
- 2 tbsp icing sugar
- ½ lime, zest and juice
- ½ 230g tin pineapple chunks or 1-2 pineapple rings in juice, cut into 8 small wedges

Method

- Put the biscuits in a small, freezer bag and bash gently with the bottom of a pan or rolling pin, to make fine crumbs.
- 2. Melt the butter in a small saucepan or microwave and stir in the biscuit crumbs.
- Spoon the buttered crumbs into the base of a glass tumbler. Use the back of a spoon to press down lightly.
- 4. Put the cream cheese, double cream, sugar, lime zest and juice in a bowl. Add 2 teaspoons of the pineapple juice from the can and whisk until thickened.
- Spoon the creamy filling onto the biscuit base.
 Top with the pineapple chunks then place in the fridge for 30 minutes. Decorate with extra lime zest if you like






