September 2023: Edinburgh Parkinson's Lecture

April 2023: Student Talks for The Bowler Travel Bursary

Engagement between members of the Edinburgh Branch and local university researchers, students and health care professionals with a research interest in Parkinson's was started by Prof. Ken Bowler. Following his death in 2019 the Branch established an annual Travel Bursary for a PhD student to attend a conference relevant to their research.

November 2023: Effects of Mindfulness Meditation and Exercise Prescription on the Confidence of People with Parkinson's to Engage in Physical Activity

Khalid Al-Ani, an Honours student in Physical Activity & Health at Napier University was looking for volunteers to join this research study. Participants will be divided into two groups: one will follow a specific exercise prescription, and the other will combine exercise with mindfulness meditation.



February 2024: NeuroCARE App – a digital health monitoring research study

Dr Johnny Tam, a Clinical Research Fellow at the Anne Rowling Regenerative Neurology Clinic spoke and answered questions about a new research study. He is looking for volunteers with Parkinson's to join the study which aims to use everyday digital devices to enable PwPs to participate in health research.
